RE: Central East Transfer Out Transmission Project Update

We are writing to provide you with further information on the current status of ATCO Electric Ltd.'s (ATCO) Central East Transfer Out Transmission Project (the Project) and next steps.

In August 2021, the Alberta Utilities Commission (AUC) approved the Project. In December 2022, the Alberta Electric System Operator (AESO) directed ATCO to begin construction of stage 1 as the generation milestone in the area for this stage has now been achieved.

Stage 1 includes building and energizing a new double circuit 240 kilovolt transmission line with conductors strung on both sides and installing new equipment at the existing Tinchebray 972S substation.

AltaLink Management Ltd. (AltaLink) was also directed by the AESO to develop a portion of the Project that falls within its respective service territory. You may receive information from AltaLink if a portion of their approved project is near you. The enclosed reference map shows ATCO's approved route in red and the connection point with AltaLink's approved route.

Next Steps

In the coming months, pre-construction activities including geotechnical surveys, environmental surveys and land acquisition will commence. An ATCO representative will contact landholders regarding any activities required on their land prior to the start of construction.

Major construction activities for the Project are not expected to begin until late 2024, we will notify directly affected landholders again as we get closer to the construction start date. Please note that timing and details may be adjusted as plans are finalized.

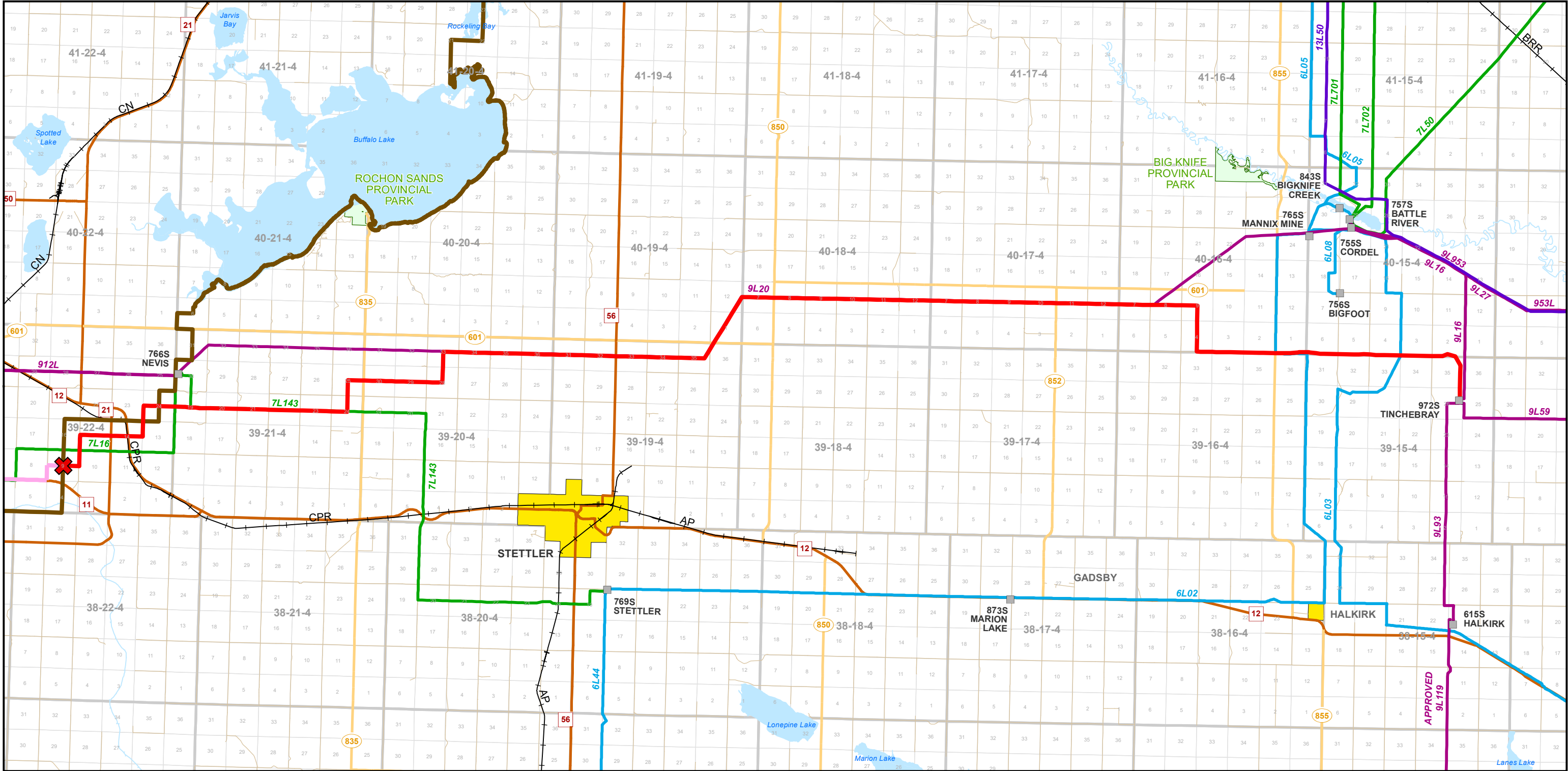

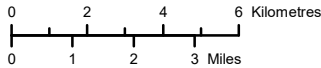
